Test	Result	Revision
Relevant to target voters	Strong: traffic safety, recreation access, and tax accountability dominate canvass notes.	Lead with neighbourhood outcomes before process language.
Distinctive	Moderate: accountability is common language.	Use proof phrase: "published timelines and public progress reports."
Credible	Strong when paired with community-board examples.	Include one concrete example in every long-form message.
Repeatable	Strong after shortening.	Final core line limited to 18 words.

"Jordan Lee will deliver safer streets and reliable local services with published timelines, clear budgets, and public progress reports."
